It is with great sadness that we report the passing on December 1, 2011, of C. Fred Kleinknecht, who served as Sovereign Grand Commander from 1985 to 2003.

Ill: Kleinknecht was born February 14, 1924, in Washington, D.C. During World War II he served in the Navy. In 1947 he took a job at the House of the Temple. In 1949 he became a mason and in 1950 he joined the Scottish Rite. He held a number of positions at the House of the Temple, being named Assistant to the Grand Commander in 1966 and Acting Grand Secretary General in 1967. He was instrumental in building the Rite's endowment infrastructure.

His leadership and influence left a big imprint on the Scottish Rite and his presence will be missed.

In selecting the recipients the committee gives extra points to members of Masonic youth groups (DeMolay, Job's Daughters, and Rainbow for Girls). 
