2018 Dinner Reservation Policy:

Annual Standing Reservations are available; for an advance fee of \$140.00 per person or \$240.00 Per Couple, paid by no later than January 31st of the effective year. After this date Prorated Annual Reservations are available at the rate of \$15.00/\$25.00 per remaining Dinner meetings.

This reservation will include dinner for all (9) stated meeting dinners and (1) Remembrance & Renewal Dinner, for the year. It will not include the dinner for our Annual Installation of Officers, which is a special catered dinner.

If you choose to pay monthly, the fee will be \$15.00 per person or \$25.00 per couple, paid at the door, with a reservation in place, made 4 days in advance.
