The Americanism Museum in the House of the Temple in Washington, D.C., is dedicated to the Masonic principles of personal, social and intellectual freedom so important to our nation. It contains a number of captivating artifacts and relics from throughout American history. Here are displayed relics of the colonial and other periods of American history. For instance, there is a foundation stone from the White House which dates back to the original construction. Discovered during renovation started in 1948, the stone bears Masonic markings and is authenticated by a letter from former President Harry S. Truman, 33°. The collection also includes a replica life mask of President Abraham Lincoln and a lodge lantern used by a Union Army Lodge during the American Civil War, President Truman's 33rd Degree Collar and various items from NASA that traveled to the moon.

cigar smoking event. The plan is to try to do something the last Tuesday of every month, so please try to give these new ideas a try, you might just find you enjoy them.


I thank you all for your continued support, and guidance. Please join us for Dinners and special events. I would also ask you to please offer your support and

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"The price of success is hard work, dedication to the job at hand, and the determination that whether we win or lose, we have applied the best of ourselves to

2016 is here and it is time to make New Year's resolutions. May 21, 2015, will mark our fifth annual Celebrating the Craft (CTC) webathon. From 6:00 PM–Midnight EST we will showcase some of the best talent in the Southern Jurisdiction as well as

provide information on our philanthropies in a fun, educational, and exciting show. In an effort to increase awareness and support for Scottish Rite philanthropies, the 2016 CTC will focus on RiteCare Scottish Rite Childhood Learning Program (SRCLP) as well as raising funds to support the House of the Temple.

For the past five years, members from across the world have pledged their time and resources to help local Orient philanthropies and the House of the Temple's Rebuilding the Temple Campaign. This year our goal is 100% participation from every Brother, Valley, and Orient.

What is CTC?

For those who don't know, Celebrating the Craft — CTC for short — is an annual webathon which supports our RiteCare Scottish Rite Childhood Language Program and our Rebuilding the Temple Campaign. Donations can be split 50-50 between local 501(c)(3) Orient Philanthropies and the House of the Temple Historic Preservation Foundation. CTC has grown to be the largest fundraising event in the Southern Jurisdiction! This would not be possible without the support of individual brethren. No gift is too small ... or too large! Thousands of brethren donating five dollars each are just as vital to the success of the program as those that can make a \$100,000 gift. Indeed, many large donors wait to see what level of participation there is by the general membership before they will make a commitment of a five-to-six figure gift or more. By your Valley participating in CTC you also are earning credits towards several requirements in the VMAP program.

What Can You Do?

There are approximately 160,000 Scottish Rite members in the Southern Jurisdiction. If each brother gave just \$5 we would raise \$800,000. However, donating money isn't the only way you can be an active participant for CTC. Volunteering your time is another valuable and rewarding way to help support our Rebuilding the Temple Campaign. Here are some ideas for how you can participate in CTC:

- Tune in to CTC and participate by watching the webathon live.
- Make a gift. Remember: no gift is too small ... or too large!
- If your Valley has a scheduling conflict, begin raising funds now and have an officer call in live during CTC.
- Create a Facebook page for CTC to update your friends and family throughout the webathon.
- Follow or participate in our social media campaign by using #CTC2016 or #SRHT2016. Using #CTC2016 and #SRHT2016 to help promote our events is a simple way we can all spread the news and be active participants in #CTC2016.

Celebrating the Craft has become both a personal and community event for Illustrious Bro. Sam Graziano, Jr., 33° and Janice Graziano. Residing in the Valley of Phoenix, the Graziano Family has been among the most active participants for CTC.

Here are 9 tips for developing better habits:

- 9. Reward yourself for a job well done!

A small reward will keep you motivated, especially on days when it is tough to stay on track. Think about how you will reward yourself ahead of time so you have something to look forward to. *
