In Memoriam Ed Sutton, 32° KCCH



Brother Edward Lloyd Sutton left us on March 15, 2011.

Ed was born April 18, 1924 in Detroit to Edward and Margaret Sutton, and lived in Ventura County for 65 years, coming from Rockford, Michigan. Ed graduated from Trenton High School in Trenton, Michigan, and then went to work at a manufacturing plant. Later, he spent 20 years as a welder for the Gas Company, and five years as operations manager at Bank of America, before becoming a sheet metal worker. He retired from R.P. Richards Inc. Construction in 1987.

Ed proudly served his country in the United States Army Air Corps during World War II, where he was a corporal. The Army decided to make him a pilot but found out he was color blind. Therefore he became a flying crew chief in the U.S. Army Air Force. He was sent to Burma and flew the "hump" in C45s. One interesting or rather scary experience happened when he was kicking and pushing packs out of the door to the troops below. He went out the door with some of the equipment they were dropping and, luckily, he had a safety rope on and the other fellows pulled him back in. Ed was discharged in 1946. He joined the Naval Reserve Construction Battalion Corps 15 years later and served for 17 years, retiring as a Chief Petty Officer Steel Worker.

Edward married Ires Mott July 2, 1949, in the Wee Kirk O' the Heather Chapel at Forest Lawn Memorial Park in Glendale. The couple

Ed was a member of Channel Islands Lodge #214 F.&A.M. and the Order of the Eastern Star, Channel Islands Chapter #78, where he served as associate patron. He was also a member of Al Malaikah Shrine.

Ed served our Valley as Master of Kadosh in 2003 and was invested as a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor that same year. He was a member of, and active participant in, our Valley for over 25 years.

Ed was a delightful fellow and we all miss his company.

again his vear we will celebrate the Remembrance and Renewal, this month on April 25, 2011 at Oxnard Masonic Temple and as usual the Chapter Knights Rose Croix is in charge of ceremony, which will start just after our dinner.

The Chapter of Rose Croix traditionally observed Maundy Thursday in the middle of Holy week. It has been called, variously, Holy Thursday, The Day of the Last Supper of the Lord and the Day of Mysteries. If we desire we have the liberty to celebrate Maundy Thursday if we choose to.

Confusion reigns in the Valley as to why we changed from Maundy Remembrance Thursday to In the past Freemasonry Renewal. has observed this special day and the Brethren have gathered throughout the world to reaffirm their faith in the universal fraternity of mankind. The first written record ofsuch observance is a ritual of the 18th degree which Charles de Ladebat prepared and published in 1856 in New Orleans.

The Code of Statutes adopted in 1866 list Maundy Thursday as a feast day and as of 1878 the statutes named its observance as obligatory. However, in deference of the rites of churches in 1994 it was deemed appropriate that the Maundy



Thursday observance be ruled non obligatory for the Scottish Rite.

A Celebration of Remembrance should then replace the traditional Maundy Thursday observance and be held near the Vernal Equinox. of Remembrance ceremony and Renewal including the Mystic Banquet is not religious observance. It is neither the Feast of the Passover nor a Sacrament of Holy Communion although commemorates the spirit of both days. What this program does recognize is the passing of our Brothers in the past year and the renewal of life. As the hills change (continued to page 10)
