Harry L. Maynard



Harry L. Maynard of Ventura California passed peacefully at home, at the advanced age of 97 on March 2, 2025. He was preceded in death by his wife of 71 years, Carolyn Messersmith Maynard, his sixyear-old son, Harry Lee, Jr., and his five siblings, of whom he was the eldest. He is survived by his daughter, Linda, son-in-law Russ Charvonia, granddaughter Alissa, grandson Keith and Keith's wife Kendall, and two great grandsons, Tanner and Hudson. His greatest pleasure in life was time spent with family, especially Alissa and Keith.

Harry was born on November 5, 1927, in DeWitt, Iowa. He resided in Ventura, California beginning in 1952, with a brief time spent living in Burbank. He graduated from DeWitt High School in 1945. He attended colleges in New York and Iowa, culminating in

a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Math, Physics, and Physical Education from the University of Northern Iowa. He was in the Navy V-5 Aviation program which ended with the conclusion of WWII, after which he went into teaching. He was the math, physics and PE teacher at Stewart High School in Iowa, where he was also the girls' basketball coach. It was there that his star forward, Carolyn, caught his eye and a romance led them to marriage in 1952.

Sports were important to him, even as a man of slight stature. He played semipro football and coached many youth teams. He supported agriculture in Ventura County through FFA, Ventura County Parks Preservation Foundation, and was an ardent golfer.

He and Carolyn moved to Ventura, California in July of 1952, where he taught in the El Rio School district for a time. He later moved to a career in finance, from which he retired as President of American Commercial Bank (now Mechanics Bank). He made many loans on a handshake and always trusted people for their word. He was especially proud of the fact that many businesses in Ventura were founded on financing he arranged.

He and Carolyn traveled the world, touching every continent except Antarctica. They traveled the US in their Winnebago, and he and his buddies delivered Winnebagos to new owners from Iowa to Ventura. The stories are legendary. Harry and Carolyn took many cruises, and they enjoyed taking family with them, especially grandson Keith when he was a little boy.

Harry was exceptionally involved in community activities, inevitably ending up in leadership positions. He was president of the Ventura Chamber of Commerce, Buenaventurans, Ventura Trade Club, Ventura Civil Service Commissioner, Redevelopment Agency, Central Ventura Association, Campaign Chair for the Arnez Program Center for the Girl Scouts, Little League coach, founding director of the Boy's Club, founding director and coach of Ventura Youth Basketball Association (VYBA), American Legion, Ventura Downtown Lions, American Bankers Association, California Bankers Association, Ventura Farm Bureau, and was a Ventura County Fair Board Director and Treasurer. He served on the boards of Community Memorial Hospital and Ivy Lawn Cemetery for several decades.

Harry was a Freemason, raised in San Buenaventura Lodge No. 214 in 1960. He was Master of the Lodge in 1968 and became active in California Grand Lodge beginning in 1976. He served as Assistant Grand Treasurer and then rose to become Grand Master of Masons in California and Hawaii in 1982-83. He was a triple valley member of Scottish Rite, serving as Personal Representative for our Valley, and became a 33rd Degree Scottish Rite Mason in 1979. He was in many auxiliary organizations in the Masonic family, and was part of the Al Malaikah Shrine Temple starting in 1963, serving as Orator in 1985. He was part of "Brownie's BBQ Crew" that raised more than \$250,000 for the Shrine Hospital system, along with other Masonic charities, one New York steak barbeque at a time.

He was also active in the Masonic youth orders, including an Honorary membership in Job's Daughters Bethels 89 and 217, Ventura Chapter Order of DeMolay, and Grand Cross of Colors with Rainbow for Girls.

His awards and accolades from organizations he supported are too many to name. One of which he was especially proud is the Harry L. Maynard Distinguished Professorship in Mathematics Secondary Education at the University of Northern Iowa.

He was passionate about Public Education and he believed it is the pathway to security, prosperity, and democracy. In his 80s he volunteered in the classroom of Fran Buker at Poinsettia Elementary School, where his daughter and granddaughter attended as children. For as long as he was able, he watched over Alissa and they watched every single Disney movie (on VHS!) together. Harry was the first in line at College Pharmacy to make sure Alissa had every newly released Beanie Baby. He was exceptionally generous to family and friends, including Carolyn's family, his family members in Iowa, and individuals in Ventura who made his acquaintance and needed a little boost. Harry was the cornerstone of our family and community.

The family would like to thank the wonderful care team at Aegis Living Ventura for their loving, compassionate, and highly competent attention to Harry for the past two years.

Orvene Carpenter, a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and esteemed community leader, passed away peacefully on February 19, 2025, at the age of 100. Born on January 31, 1925, in Paris, Arkansas, Orvene was the eighth of nine children born to Elmer and Susie Carpenter. All his siblings preceded him in death.

Orvene's early life was rooted in the hardworking spirit of rural Arkansas. He grew up on a cattle and hay farm instilling in him a strong work ethic that would define his life. He also excelled in athletics, playing as a forward on his high school basketball team and later for the California Army National Guard.

Marvel began in the fourth grade in Arkansas. They reconnected in Port Hueneme, California, in 1943 and married in 1946. Their marriage spanned 75 years until Georgia's passing in 2021.

Orvene was a proud veteran, serving his country with distinction. He enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps in July 1943. He served in the South Pacific with the 4th Marine Air Wing during World War II as a tail gunner in a Dauntless dive bomber and earned an honorable discharge in November 1945. While a member of the California Army National Guard 40th Infantry Division, they were called to active duty in Korea in September 1950. Throughout the Korean War, he was the Senior enlisted man of the division Post office, rising to the rank of Master Sergeant, and returned home after his discharge in May 1952.

His commitment to public service extended beyond his military service. Orvene began his career with the U.S. Postal Service in Port Hueneme in February 1946, rising to the position of Postmaster in 1970. He continued his postal career as Postmaster in Oxnard from March 1975 until his retirement in 1986.

Orvene's dedication to his community was further demonstrated by his remarkable 32-year tenure on the Port Hueneme City Council, serving from 1964 to 1996, making him the longest-serving council member/mayor in the city's history. He was also a respected member of Masonic Lodge 341 of Oxnard, which he joined in 1955, serving as Master of the Lodge in 1963. He was also a member of several Masonic-affiliated organizations.

Orvene was a loving patriarch. He was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Georgia Rae, his sons Gerald and Dennis, his daughter Janice Bogner, and his grandson Trevor Carpenter. He is survived by his grandchildren: Jeremy Carpenter, Megan (Carpenter) Hamlin, Geoff DeCesari, Jonathan Carpenter, and Janelle (DeCesari) Anderson. He also leaves behind nine great-grandchildren and one great-grandchild, who will cherish his memory.

Orvene Carpenter's life was one of service, dedication, humor, and love. He will be deeply missed by his family, friends, and the community he served so faithfully.

A graveside service was held on, March 11, at the Conejo Mountain Memorial Park in Camarillo, with a reception following. David VadBunker did the Masonic committal at the graveside. Harold Bogner acted as Chaplin along with Geoff DeCesari - who also participate in the committal service. Following that the Flags were presented.

Orvene was a fixture in the Scottish Rite, as well as in Oxnard Lodge #341, and the local community. He will be greatly missed by our membership and the community.
