Our next stated meeting will be February 10. The program is to be announced. Dinner reservations are due by February 6, to Harold Bogner (see contact information above). The cost is \$15 for individuals or \$25 for couples with timely reservations.

Longer term, several major events are planned for 2020. The Scottish Rite Leadership Workshops this year include one scheduled for April 24-25 in San (Others will be on Diego, CA. March 13-14 in Charlotte, NC and March 27-28 in St. Louis, MO.) This year's theme is Passing the Tools of Leadership. These workshops provide an excellent opportunity for leaders of different valleys to get together and exchange ideas. Given the near proximity of the workshop we hope many of our members can attend.

Looking a little further ahead, on June 26-28 the valleys of Southern California are planning an Orient reunion, to be held at Long Beach which the Scottish Rite, at mandatory degrees plus 12 additional degrees will be exemplified. June 5-7 in Oakland the 5 mandatory degrees plus the other 12 degrees will be exemplified by the valleys of Northern California. The plan is to switch the optional degrees between the North and South the following year. This will allow candidates and members who desire to see all 29 degrees to do so either by attending both reunions this summer, or by reunions in Southern California two years in a row. If you are interested in taking advantage of this opportunity then be sure to put these dates on your calendar. Valley is scheduled to confer the 18th Degree. We are starting to line up cast members and stage crew for this event and could use your help.

The Scottish Rite Builders is planning to hold its 8th annual event on July 31 to August 3, 2020, in Lake Tahoe. (This is related to the Tough Mudders events previously held, but that activity will not be part of this event.) This is a chance to work on building improving teams. participation, Masonic education. fund-raising and public awareness, and plan for 2021. It will include a complete list of speakers and topics.
