# **News of the Valley**

On January 14, 2019, we held our 40th Annual Installation of Our installing team, Officers. The new Heads of the Bodies are pictured on the cover. As in the past, Anacapa Lodge #710 served the Installation Dinner, which everyone enjoyed.

At our February stated meeting we had the pleasure of welcoming Ill. Frank Loui, 33°, Sovereign Grand Inspector General for the Orient of California, and his wife Jeanne.

Last year we again qualified for Supreme Council's Valley Membership Achievement Project. Congratulations to Sir Knight Raul Cifuentes, 32° KCCH, for managing this effort. We are already making plans for the current year with Raul's guidance.

Congratulations to Brother Hector Lopez, 32°, who has been installed as Senior Warden of Mosaic Lodge #184, AF&AM, in Eastlake, Colorado.

Our former tiler, Brother Robert Kennedy Jr., 32°, has now relocated to Idaho, and reports that he is doing fine there.

### **Scottish Rite Honours**

Since honours will be awarded this year it seems like an appropriate time to review them. In the odd numbered years such as this year the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Southern Jurisdiction, U.S.A., confers recognition upon brethren for outstanding service. Honours (The Scottish Rite uses the English spelling "honours" rather than "honors") are conferred by a unanimous vote of the Supreme Council. Here is how that works.

The rank of **Knight Commander of the Court of Honour** ("Red Hat) is not a degree but an honour bestowed upon members who are deserving of recognition. The respective Sovereign Grand Inspector Generals or Deputies likewise nominate members for this honour. This investiture is a prerequisite to receiving the Thirty-third Degree, but is not meant to imply that the recipient will ever receive the Thirty-third Degree.

The rank of **Inspector General Honorary of the Thirty-third Degree** ("White Hat") is an actual degree. Before the Biennial Session of the Supreme Council, the Sovereign Grand Inspector Generals and Deputies nominate a small number of members to receive this honour.

The honours may be bestowed/conferred in Washington, D.C. during the Supreme Council Biennial Sessions in August for those attending. Others from Southern California will receive their honours on September 21, 2019, in San Diego.

Regarding obtaining Scottish Rite Honours, first understand that neither the Knight Commander Court of Honour (KCCH) or the Inspector General Honorary of the Thirty-third Degree (33°) can be applied for, and if a person asks for the Investure or Honour, it must be refused.

You must have been a 32° Scottish Rite Mason for a period of 48 months to be eligible to be considered to receive the Knight Commander Court of Honour (KCCH).

Sometimes there is confusion as to how someone "gets to be a 33° Mason". Before each Biennial Session, each Sovereign Grand Inspector General or Deputy receives nominations of men in his Orient from their Personal Representatives as recommendations only. These nominations must be approved by the Supreme Council without a dissenting vote. A Brother must have been a Knight Commander Court of Honour (KCCH) for 46 months before he can be elected to receive the Inspector General Honorary of the Thirty-third Degree (33°). It is given for service to the Scottish Rite, to Masonry in general, or civic service.

It is often said that we receive honours for what we are going to do, not for what we have already done.

The number of honours awarded has been declining in recent years and we expect that trend to continue this year.
